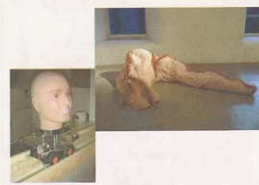

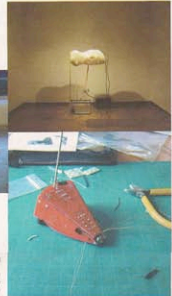
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COINING SHOWS
The Hildreth Museum and Sculpture Garden has announced its exhibition schedule through 2009 and includes several DC area artists along with the Museum and New York.
